General Meetings

This semester we held six virtual general meetings and several virtual events! The average attendance per meeting was 26 attendees and we have had over 120 students attend our events! WE20 Global Conference

"This year, despite all the challenges, 15 CSU SWE members were still fortunate enough to attend the SWE global conference WE20. The conference was 100% virtual and was held over two weeks from November 2-13. More than 15,000 attendees from around the world were able to go to over 200 real time and asynchronous sessions for professional development, demonstrations, speakers, the annual awards ceremony, and virtual networking. The infamous career fair was spread out of 4 days in the virtual format with hundreds of companies. CSU SWE officers also shared their personal and daily experiences with the conference via our social media platforms."

Evening with Industry

This semester we held our biannual Evening with Industry event virtually for the first time! We tried to simulate the come-andgo atmosphere of EWI with multiple virtual rooms for students to attend. We had 54 attendees! Thanks to our sponsors, Lockheed Martin, HPE, RSM, Woodward, Seagate and Ardent Mills, and the virtual environment of the event, EWI was free for all students! We also raised over \$1600. We also had an incredible keynote speaker, Annie Elefante, a CSU SWE alumni.

Peer and Professional Mentoring

This year, we were still able to put on both the Peer Mentoring and Professional Mentoring Program through online platforms. Multiple virtual socials were held for each program that highlighted networking, growing as a mentor/mentee, and tackling difficult conversations. The mentoring programs this year connected undergraduate women in engineering from 8 different majors to professionals in industry from 19 different employers. This year, the Mentoring Program as a whole has 40 pairs, and is expected to grow in the next semester.
